INTRODUCTION

CHILDREN IN LOCKDOWN is a commissioning programme, initiated in 2021, that supports artists to work with children, helping them deal with the challenges of the pandemic.

This project, curated by Stages Theatre Group and supported by Kindernothilfe (KNH), will commission artists in Sri Lanka to respond creatively to the theme of 'Children in Lockdown' by either producing artworks such as plays, books, visual art, scripts, films, music, research etc...; or conducting workshops for children or institutions that support children (schools, child rights organizations etc.).

COMMISSIONING PROCESS

Stages Theatre Group put out an open call to artists in Sri Lanka to contribute to this project in mid-February. Applications were open for artists (both adult and child artists) to propose projects (in any language – Sinhala/ Tamil/ English) that relate to the challenges and experiences of children during the Covid-19 pandemic.

The Open Call received an immense response, and a total of 80 applications from artists around the country were received in a range of art forms such as visual art, dance, theatre, research, animation, creative writing, workshops, magic and puppetry. 36 artists (including 9 child artists) were shortlisted by the curators – Ruwanthie de Chickera and Malith Hegoda – based on the originality of their idea; relevance of the theme; artistic vision; outreach of artwork; and the artists' experience.

The following document will introduce you to the 36 shortlisted artists (20 of whom will be commissioned), and their proposed art projects for the programme.

'CHILDREN IN LOCKDOWN' FESTIVAL

The Children in Lockdown Artist Commissioning hopes to showcase the commissioned artists and their artworks in a festival which will be open to public, in December 2021.

CHATROOM 2021

This project builds on an adaptation of Enda Walsh's 2005 play 'Chatroom', produced through Studiolusion in 2017. The play explores the effect of cyberbullying on teenagers with social anxiety and depression, and offers clarity and hope for those who may find themselves faced with these issues. The 2021 version, however, will be rethought with a group of teenagers to address the issues faced by young children on the internet today, in the midst of the pandemic.

"...For many children and teens, social distancing during the pandemic means the only contact they have with their peers is virtual. While virtual platforms like Instagram, TikTok and Snapchat allow kids to stay connected with the outside world, they are also more vulnerable to cyberbullying, shaming, and exploitation. It takes a conscious effort to unplug...."

MLECHCHAYAN (BARBARIANS)

Research-based Solo Contemporary Dance Performance

This will be a research-based performance where the artist will use elements of the Indian martial art Kalariyapaittu in creating a solo contemporary dance performance on how domestic violence on the rise has been affecting parents, children and families during the pandemic.

"...I believe that contemporary dance and Kalariyapaittu are two mediums that will enable children to express themselves through movement when words fail them. This will also be something that they can learn to practise in their free time as they are physically inhibited during lockdown; it is bound to boost their confidence..."

"Parents' behaviour in front of their children has undoubtedly affected during children during lockdown, as some of them are now fulltime witnesses to the kinds of aggressions or domestic violence that can occur in some households. This will leave a deep impact on children's mental wellbeing. Through this project I hope to use contemporary dance and martial art forms as mediums of communication to listen and work with children and create a piece that will make larger community aware of the consequences of domestic violence."

A series of magic training workshops of children confined to children's care homes, to help them build their confidence, communication skills and pique their curiosity and interest in the art of magic. In the 6 hour workshop that will be conducted at each Home, the children will each be given a magic toolkit and taught how to perform and present these tricks publicly.

A short film that hopes to address the issue of child abuse, based on the writer's own lived experience of sexual abuse in her childhood. The story follows a little girl who is sexually abused and is entrapped in a love story with her adult abuser. The cast and the crew working on the production are all persons who have experienced child abuse in some form.

Inoka Palliyaguru, an amateur script writers will be accommodated in the Children in Lockdown project through the Mentoring programme, thereby being given the opportunity and the funds to work closely under the guidance of a professional screen writer who will serve as her mentor and guide and help her develop the film script of her film.

"I feel it's important to know the situation that the children are faced on a lock-down than actually judging it from a distance. Even though in my childhood, I was not in a lockdown situation, I was raised in a conformed family environment, which in reality felt more or less of a lockdown.

The emotional trauma that a child in need, is beyond words that could be expressed. Therefore I believe it is important to express it through mediums such as cinema and theatre."

The story is about a 10 year old girl – Vidusha – who finds herself in the confines of her home, barred from talking to her neighbour friend; then barred from watching TV, subsequently barred from using the phone and constantly irritated at the thought of zoom schooling. She feels she is a prisoner in her own home, imprisoned by jail guards – her own parents.

Shavindri Peries, an amateur poet and researcher will be accommodated in the Children in Lockdown project through the Mentoring programme, thereby being given the opportunity and the funds to work closely under the guidance of a professional psychologist/researcher who will serve as her mentor and guide and help her develop her creative research into mental health.

"...I hope that my project if I am selected, will be able to help others as well as myself to understand, break through the stigma surrounding mental health and develop mechanisms to combat mental health issues...."

"...As a 14 years old child of the modern world who is also facing this corona pandemic situation I have to say that most of us are stuck at home and most of us have our faces glued to computer/ laptop/tab/iPad and phone screens. But through my book I want to tell all of the other children in this to take your eyes off those screens and look around you. Look at the nature. Look at the animals.

The story depicts how parents use children as pawns for emotional blackmail in broken marriages.

"Children are used as pawns by adults – especially in broken marriages. The lockdown has caused immense pressure on relationships between parents and children especially in broken families. Do parents behave like parents? I hope to deal with questions such as these in my film..

Irfan and his family are in Sri Lanka as they have sought asylum having to leave their own country – Pakistan.

The performance is based on the lived experience of Irfan as a refugee and father of two young girls who have been pushed into further alienation due to lockdown. Through the script and performance created with his own two daughters, Irfan will be addressing the issues of the challenges faced by asylum seeker families and children during the pandemic.

"Being children it wasn't easy for them to pause their activities which they loved and enjoyed a lot, they were confused, distressed, and unanswered. It was a disturbing time for both of them but after a time period they realized that they have to go through this difficult time with positivity and supportive behaviour towards each other, for it is only love and support that can hold everything together in bad times. I hope this project will play a vital role for the betterment of children's mental and physical health"

The Fiction "Isolated: Teens and Lockdown" will be a collection of short stories written by a teenager, which revolve around fictional teenagers going through real-life situations during the COVID-19 Pandemic, which would deal with the struggles most teenagers face due to the challenges they face, while isolated and confined to the boundaries of their homes.

Ramithu Sellahewa, an amateur writer will be accommodated in the Children in Lockdown project through the Mentoring programme, thereby being given the opportunity and the funds to work closely under the guidance of a professional children's fiction writer who will serve as his mentor and guide and help him develop his short stories to publishing level.

"...This fiction would also take inspiration from segments of my life as well, and I believe I want to inspire aspiring teenagers, who can set their boundaries loose by looking through the eyes of others through a gateway known as a Book. LOCKED DOWN

Research/interviews of up to 50 children and subsequent performance talk

Leeth is an A/L student who hopes to conduct interviews with approximately 50 children of various ages, genders, and geographic backgrounds in Sri Lanka. The interviews will document children's ideas, feelings, and stories about their experiences in the pandemic. After assimilating the information shared by the children, Leeth will prepare and deliver performance talk about children's views on Lockdown.

Leeth Sinhage, a budding young actor will be accommodated in the Children in Lockdown project through the Mentoring programme, thereby being given the opportunity and the funds to work under the guidance of a professional writer/director who will serve as his mentor and guide and help him develop the material of his interviews into a script and then a performance.

"Locked-Down" will be a research-based talk that explores the various perceptions school going Sri Lankan children had (or have) about lockdown. The idea behind this research is to really try and understand children's own opinions about the pandemic. Sometimes their opinions will be quite different to what society and adults will assume."

TRAPPED

Three dimensional sculpture and painting (2x2m), created out of electronic waste and face masks.

A three dimensional sculpture and painting will be created by the artist, out of electronic waste and face masks that will essentially consist of a child's face being carried by her own hands, both made out of e-waste, and red strings made out of face masks binding her to the borders of the box she's placed in. The idea is to address the effect of mass digitization, isolation and the resultant anxiety on children during the pandemic. This would approximately be a 2x2 m sculpture contained inside 1/4 of a wooden box that is only closed on one side. This will be created in an eco-friendly manner with only waste material.

Encelletta Solomon, a budding visual artist will be accommodated in the Children in Lockdown project through the Mentoring programme, thereby being given the opportunity and the funds to work closely under the guidance of a professional visual artist who will serve as her mentor and guide and help her develop her art work.

"Children struggle to overcome rising anxiety and depression levels as a result of the family's economic downturn, stress, high mortality rates, uncertainty and the disma tling of long-distance relationships, among other factors. All of these factors can be individually symbolized,"

2020 was a tough year for 9 year old Lucas. Not only was he stuck all alone at home with his mom Natalie, but they both had to deal with her discovery and treatment of breast cancer. In 'Lucas in Lockdown', Lucas will reflect, draw and share with us stories of his lockdown experience with his single mom Natalie. Natalie will be illustrating, photographing and helping Lucas tell his story.

"Lucas missed his school friends, he missed playing outside and in his own words, "I missed having fun". I also missed the few precious hours I had to myself when he was at school and not having time to myself made me even worse company. Lucas played up. I played up. And unknown to me, a tumour had begun to grow in my right breast that would lead the two of us down yet another crisis path that year. 2020 wasn't our year. Lucas and I want to be honest and true to how difficult life was and how strained our relationship became"

ONLINE SCHOOL

A 40-60 minute film, written, directed, and devised by a group of 18 child artists of the Stages Junior Ensemble.

The Stages Junior Ensemble, a children-led ensemble theatre group with child artists aged between 9-15 years – functions under the guidance of the artists of Stages Theatre Group. The Stages Junior Ensemble will develop a 40 - 60 minute ensemble performance on the theme 'Online Schooling'. Online Schooling is a humorous look at the experiences of Sri Lankan children during lockdown, as they and their teachers and families struggled to adapt to the challenges of online schooling. Online schooling has been created by children during the lockdown through devised theatre workshops over zoom and will be rehearsed and performed by an ensemble of up to 18 children. Online Schooling will be a scripted, performed, shot and edited film ready for release.

"As the pandemic drags on, it's clear that not all kids are all right.

Social distancing and the pressure of 'keeping up' through 'zoom school' is getting to them. This comedic, devised ensemble film production will showcase to adults, parents and educators the first-hand experience of children of 'online schooling."

Workshops targeting young males and fathers who have shared these roles and have lived experiences which can be shaped for the better going forward. This would be done by reorienting them on changing gender roles and divisions of labour at household level which is more equitable and bucks the patriarchal social and cultural norms dominating individual behaviour.

The story looks at a family in a dire situation as well as the impact of the pandemic on a hearing and speech impaired child whose main access to communicating with the outside world (lip-reading) is also now impaired owing to mandatory mask-wearing.

It intends to help them cope with not only their physical, but psychological inhibitions during this uncertain time.

The story stems from the writer's own lived experience of domestic violence and her observations of her young brother's response to the pandemic, as well as her keen interest to use the comic medium to reach out to educate and relieve young children restricted to the boundaries of their homes.

"The protagonist of my story is a young boy, who, like many young boys during this time, is paralysed by his experience of being locked indoors. Through this story, where I follow two young children as they journey to a fantastical land,

I attempt to relate how a child's lonely world can be compensated through their imagination and how they can reclaim their disintegrating world. Once we enable them to open up the doors in their minds, the impacts of the physical doors restricting their physical movement can be duly addressed."
